<p>Volunteers Make a Difference!</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 169 volunteers supported 5 city special events • Adopt-a-Park has 8 volunteer groups and 3 individuals helping to maintain 13 parks and landscaped areas around the city • 23 of 25 sections of the city Parkway – 2.5 miles - have been adopted and maintained by 13 volunteer individuals and organizations. • 101 volunteers helped set up and run the Halloween Carnival, attended by 1,343 community members • Police Department landscaping has been maintained with the help of 2 volunteer groups contributing 115 hours • 1,551 hours of support for library activities and programs • 23 coaches served 255 youth in the Youth Basketball Program • 6 Open Gym volunteers oversaw 147+ hours of community recreation • 7 teenagers serve on the Library Teen Advisory Council • 4 businesses assisted with installation of city holiday decorations • 32 volunteers served 200 at the annual Breakfast with Santa • 2 library volunteers aided citizens with 83 hours of genealogy research • 25 volunteers helped pull off the Daddy Daughter Dance, attended by 675 fathers and daughters from the community • 12 hours of clerical help supported administration at City Hall • 12 volunteers spent 53 hours servicing 6 Little Re(a)d Bookshelves around the city • 167 hours of Walking for Wellness was led by 4 volunteers • 45 hours of volunteer support at the Roy Raley Ice Rink
