Two volunteers from the library qualified: Dana Hartman & Margaret Jones, as did four Parks & Rec volunteers: Roger Harwerth, Jerry Scott, Norma Scott, and Adrie Traum.

Soon, Chuck Wood will receive a volunteer sweatshirt to mark 500 hours as a city volunteer. Beside his extensive work on the Pioneer Park Rebuild project, Chuck has also donated his time for the Neighborhood Revitalization Project, and as a Ski Bus Chaperone for Parks & Rec. Tikhon Gilson, who volunteers at the library, has just surpassed the 1,000 hour mark, and will be receiving an official City of Pendleton volunteer jacket. Tikhon has donated the second-highest number of hours at the City on record. He has volunteered since 2011, and comes in 3 days per week to empty the book drop, check items in, and shelve books. 
A Sad Good-Bye, A Brand-New Beginning
