Formally established in 2009, the City of Pendleton's volunteer program has been making a difference for the benefit of our community. By the numbers, in 2014:

296 citizens were signed up to volunteer in city departments

128 had volunteer placements

5,522 hours of service were performed during this period

\$117,894 value of volunteer services

President's Volunteer Service Award Recipients

As an encouragement for more individuals to volunteer, in 2003 the national Presidential Volunteer Service Awards were started by the President's Council on Service and Civic Participation as a way of thanking and honoring Americans who, by example, inspire others to engage in volunteer service. The City of Pendleton, as a certified organization, recognizes City volunteers who qualify for the award by committing the required number of service hours during a 12 month period.

Nine volunteers qualified in 2014 and were presented with their awards at the April 7th City Council meeting by Mayor Phillip Houk.
