## **New Business:**

- 📉 First reading of Ordinance 4000 to amend Ordinance 3845, the Urban Development Code, and Ordinance 3442 changing the zones: These ordinance change the last west of the Pendleton Convention Center from "High Density" to "Central-Mixed Use" to allow for development Residentially occupied land will not be affected. No vote is taken on a first reading.
- M Consor North America: Task Order #25: 10-year Benchmark Update for Collection System Master Plan: Authorizes up to \$271,722 to update the plan.
- 🖌 Consor North America: Task Order #24: 10-year Benchmark Update for Water System Master Plan: Authorizes up to \$299,144 to update the plan.
- M Resolution 2906 of the City of Pendleton, Oregon Authorizing a Loan from the Special Public Works Fund: The City has been approved for a public works development project loan from the Oregon Infrastructure Finance Authority of Business Oregon. The loan will be for \$10,083,000 to be used for the development of water infrastructure.
- **N** Approval of SDWSRF Loan S17018 Amendment Number 3: This extends the project close-out to Feb. 29, 2024: The City's original \$14,855,000 Safe Drinking Water State Revolving Fund (SDWSRF) Loan Agreement S17018 has been amended twice before.
