



**Community Discussion:** David Dudek approached the council about developments not in compliance with fire codes.

## Consent Agenda:

Minutes of the Aug. 2, 2022 meeting; agreement with Euvalcree to identify and disperse COVID relief funds received through GEODC community development block grant

## **New Business:**

- Airport Runway 29 Threshold relocation of new taxi lanes and Apron rehab bid award: City awarded a project bid to High Desert Aggregate, pending FAA grant approval. High Desert Aggregate was the low bidder for a project to correct an FAA identified "hot spot" and confusing geometry where the taxiway enters the threshold, making the runway safer for public travel. The new taxi lane will create more shovel ready area for hangar construction, and the Apron rehab will overlay the current aging asphalt that is unraveling. These \$6.7 million projects are being paid with grants and matching funds.
- Water Filtration Plant Membrane Replacement: City Council approved a purchase order for ZENON Environmental Corporation for replacement of membranes, on-site support and programming upgrades. The membranes are used for water filtration and provide a physical barrier for disease causing organisms, including protozoans and numerous types of bacteria, and have a lifespan of about 14 years.
- Public Rights-of-Way Vacation: A petition was filed with the Planning Department to vacate 100 feet of Southeast 19th Street off Goodwin and Isaac Avenue. City Council authorized city staff to investigate and bring the issue before the Pendleton Planning Commission.
- Convention Center Staffing Request: Pendleton Convention

  Center requested adding one additional full-time utility

  worker to the staff.
