 Minutes of the Oct. 18, 2022, meeting; approve OLCC Permit application for The Studio Pendleton, LLC, as recommended by Police Chief


Bid Award:

 Manhole Rehabilitation Project Bid Award: Council authorized a bid to Integrity Inspection Services, of Nampa, ID, for \$108,715 for the 2022 Manhole Rehabilitation Project. This is the second year of a five-year project to reduce groundwater and river water leaking into the city sewer system. This project focuses on sealing contact points at 90 manholes downstream of the 2021 project.

New Business:

 IT Contracts for Internet Service Provider and IT/Network Support Services: *The City has sole-sourced IT support services with IMESD for many years, but IMESD is ending IT service for the City of Pendleton to focus on its highest priority: school districts' IT needs. To replace that service, the City is negotiating an Internet Service Provider contract with Wtechlink and an intergovernmental agreement (IGA) for ongoing network support services with the City of Hermiston. The City is using Hermiston IT to assist with several network items, and that work has been at an hourly rate ahead of IGA approval. Contracts are expected to be brought to council at the next meeting.*

 Report from Business Oregon on UAS : Ryan DeGrofft with Business Oregon presented on the UAS Economic Impact Report and how the state can better support drone programs statewide.

 Resolution 2887 - 8th Street Bridge Infrastructure Improvement Acceptance: *The 1909 Lee Street Grade Bridge was replaced in 2019. This Resolution finalizes that process as the City of Pendleton accepts jurisdiction (ownership) of infrastructure improvements.*
