In 2018, 3,546 hours of service were contributed through community volunteers

- 367 individuals and 98 groups make up the volunteer corps
- Volunteers were utilized in four city departments
- \$92,459.82 in-kind value of volunteer time
- 42 new city volunteers in 2018
- 32 volunteer jobs served

<p>How Are City of Pendleton Volunteers Making An Impact?</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 17 volunteers work alongside staff to provide library activities and programs • 9 groups and individuals have adopted city Parks and Parkways, helping to keep them maintained and litter free • 36 hours was committed by volunteers stocking the Little Re(a)d Bookshelf stations around the community • 137 hours of Open Gym run by volunteers allowed for community recreation programs, including one for special needs • 6 community organizations worked with the City and the Chamber of Commerce to install holiday lights and decorations in Pendleton • 1 Police Department volunteer has provided 204 hours of clerical support • 4 volunteers led the Walking for Wellness program totaling 120 hours • 73 volunteers committed 234 hours of service at the Halloween Carnival, providing a safe and fun event for the 1,700+ attendees • A holiday movie was presented free to the community with the help of 11 volunteers • 18 volunteers helped with Flag Football, Soccer, and Rugby programs • Roy Raley Ice Rink received 100 hours of support from volunteers helping with rink and equipment maintenance • 24 volunteers assisted staff at the Daddy Daughter Dance, attended by 600 community members • 23 volunteer hours of digital scanning archived city records • 6 individual volunteers and 7 groups worked alongside staff at a Park Clean-up Day at Pioneer Park • The Youth Basketball Program was led by 29 volunteer coaches • 41 hours of Genealogy research was conducted by a volunteer • Youth Track Meet had 45 hours of assistance from a volunteer group
